

### Total Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act Funding Announced for California

California has had **\$20 billion**<sup>i</sup> announced in Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) funding (formula and discretionary). Of this amount, **\$15.14**<sup>ii</sup> billion is dedicated to transportation-related projects, **\$4.60 billion**<sup>iii</sup> is dedicated to clean energy, power, and environment projects, **\$177 million**<sup>iv</sup> is dedicated to broadband projects, and **\$36.07 million**<sup>v</sup> is for other projects.

#### Total Projects Funded with IIJA Funding

As of May 10, 2023, California has invested **\$3.69 billion**<sup>vi</sup> in transportation projects.

#### **Total Jobs Created**

Since May 10, 2023, **47,992 jobs**<sup>vii</sup> have been created in California.

#### Disadvantaged Business Enterprise

From October 1, 2022, through April 30, 2023, Caltrans has awarded **24.54 percent** of contracts to Disadvantaged Business Enterprise. Our goal for Federal Fiscal Years 2022-2024 is **22.2 percent**.<sup>viii</sup>

## Investments in Disadvantaged Communities

As of October 4, 2022, a total of **\$3.76 billion** on 843 Active Transportation Program projects will benefit disadvantaged communities throughout California. Four of the 208 projects in Northern California, totaling **\$14.7 million**, are

statewide initiatives, which support transportation partners across California to increase their opportunity to successfully deliver active transportation projects.

Moreover, 93.8% of Active Transportation

Program project dollars (\$3.76 billion out of \$4.0 billion) benefit disadvantaged communities.ix

#### **Notable Grant Awards**

California has received almost \$2.2 billion in transportation discretionary grants for 314 projects. This represents 12.04 percent of the national total. Please find attached a supplementary spreadsheet for the data on California's grant awards we are presently tracking.

  Provides grants to deploy, install, and operate advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, mobility, efficiency, system performance, intermodal connectivity, and infrastructure return on investment.
- Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Opportunity (Mega, INFRA, and Rural) May 2023 ...
  - National Infrastructure Project Assistance Program (MEGA)
     Provides grants to surface transportation infrastructure that are too large or complex for traditional funding programs that will have a significant national or regional impact.
  - <u>Nationally Significant Multimodal Freight and Highway Projects (INFRA)</u>
     Provides grants for multimodal freight and highway projects of national or regional significance.
