





Obligation Plan Status Updates – NEW

PROCESS

- Why a new process?
- Updates using separate Excel files were difficult to track, update, and not efficient for reporting and projecting OA utilization for the FFY.





Obligation Plan Status Updates

- Bi-weekly status meetings will be held from April to August.
- Obligation plans will be uploaded to new dynamic monitoring system.
- MPO/RTPAs provide status updates to Districts prior to meetings.
- District staff will have access to new Smartsheet
 Dynamic View and be able to make updates and
 provide status updates (demonstration to follow).
- Potential OA related issues are discussed during status meetings with Districts and MPO/RTPAs.





Status Updates (Cont.)

- Obligation status of project
 - Project was obligated (input actual obligation amount and date of obligation)
 - Obligation no longer anticipated this FFY
- Update Level of Certainty and/or Risk level.
- Provide status updates related to obligation of funds.
- Modify Formula OA Funds used on the project.
- Add new projects to the plan.
